Antrim Blitzes Hit the Target



Antrim Coaching and Games have recently hosted a number of Go Games & Supertouch blitzes for clubs and schools aimed at getting kids playing games over the winter months in a bid to develop their skills for next year's set of games. First up was the Indoor U8 Hurling Go Games Blitzes in October (13th, 20th, 27th) at Andersonstown Leisure Centre. A total of 10 clubs, 12 teams and 118 players participated. St. Pauls were represented with 3 teams and Lamh Dhearg and Sarsfields have two teams at the blitz. A special mention to McDermotts

in attending their first hurling blitz.

U8 Go Games Football blitzes were over 3 weeks at Woodlands, 7 clubs, 12 teams and 94 players participated.

For the U10s there were indoor hurling blitzes on Saturday mornings in Andersonstown leisure centre with large turnouts from the city clubs and also appearances from Larthna Og and Glenavy. 10 clubs, 12 teams and 100 children played with Rossa, Sarsfields and Lamh Dhearg fielding two teams.

After the U10's it was the

U11's turn in Andytown. 9 clubs attended with Brid Og fielding two teams. 77 players played their hearts out. Moving on to the teens of Antrim. Woodlands hosted U13 football & hurling Supertouch blitzes on alternative weekends for 6 weeks. 4 clubs/50 players contested the football and 9 clubs/90 players battled in the hurling blitzes.

The Coaching and Games dept would like to thank all the clubs, mentors, players and young whistlers who took part and made the blitzes a success.

Kieran Megraw, Ross Corbett who played their part in making the blitz run efficiently.

There will be future blitzes and hopefully more of the schools will be able to participate as the Super Touch Games are designed to encourage players to play rather than focusing on who wins.


